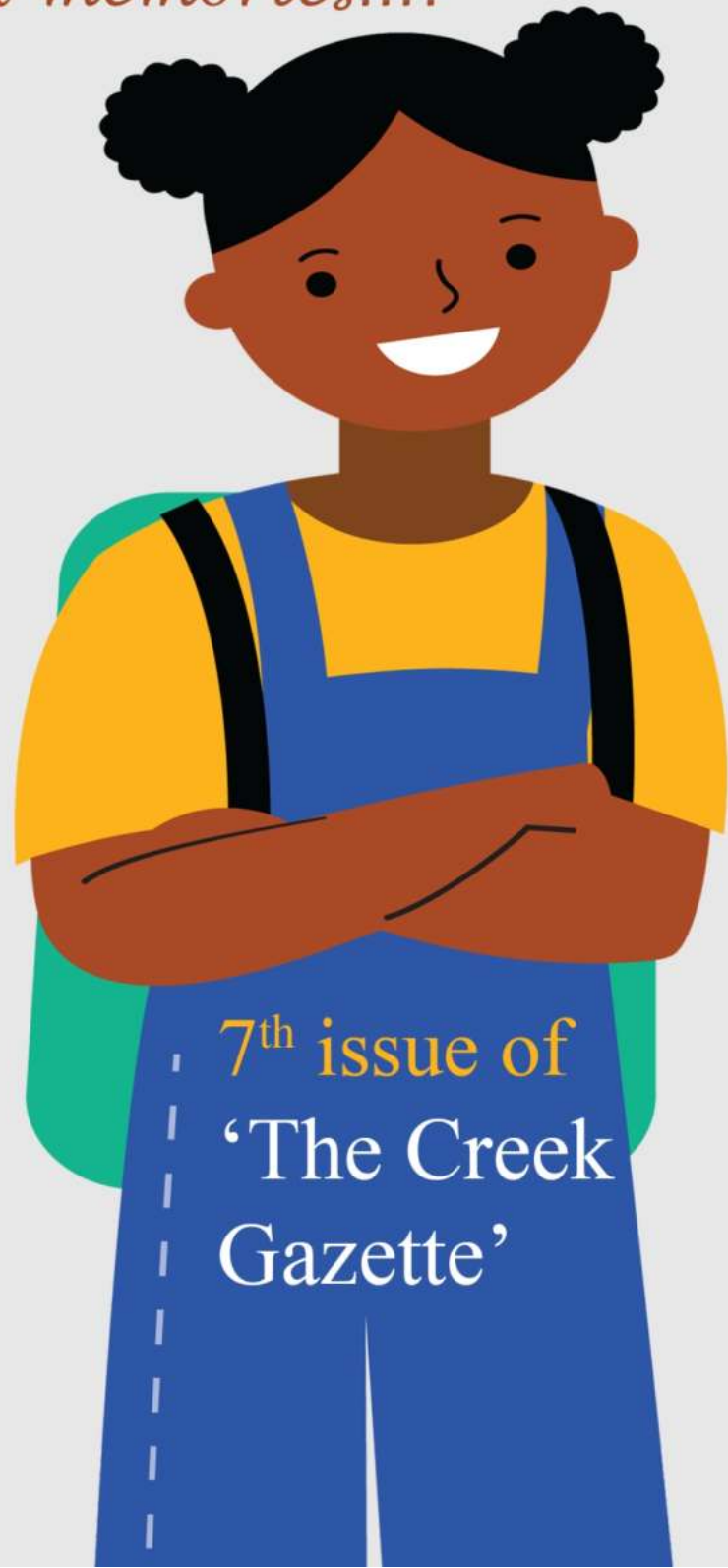

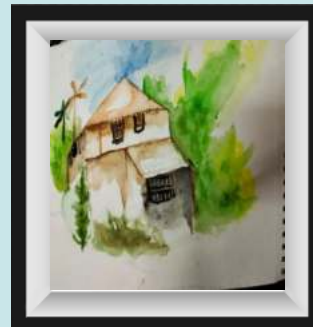

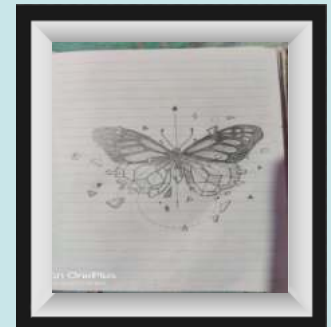

The Creek Planet School Neptune Campus started its academic year of 21-22 in March. First and foremost I would like to thank the Almighty for all the blessings showered upon us. I am very happy to inform you that we have received the CBSE Affiliation for Secondary School. This is an achievement for TCPS - Neptune. We ensure you that we will continue our efforts to achieve excellence not only on advanced academics but also on extra-curricular and co-curricular activities. The academic year 21-22 commenced with the exclusive online classes initially and later, a hybrid model of online as well as face to face classes were introduced. Detailed guidelines were issued by the authority to be followed during the pandemic. It was a complete lockdown in the entire country. Schools were closed but not the process of learning. 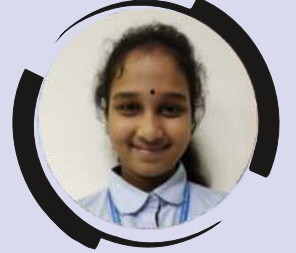

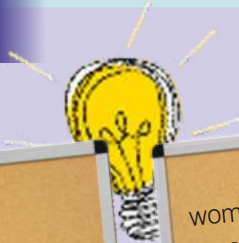

THE CLEVER FOX

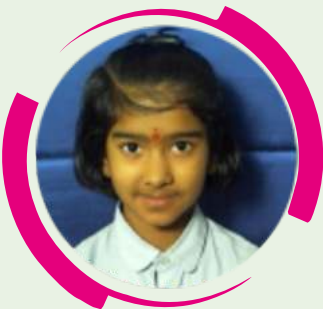

ACADEMIC YEAR-2021 an overview! "Education is what remains after one has forgotten what one has learned in school." —Albert Einstein. The Pandemic has taught us countless lessons in life which have literally compelled us to re-think every endeavour of our existence. Education in the last year has gone through a dramatic change from brick-and-mortar classrooms to virtual sessions. Our ability to steer this propeller and think divergently amidst the crisis allowed us to take flight in a direction we could never have thought of. As quoted by Leo Buscaglia, "Change is the end result of all true learning." Through a plethora of technological tools, we examined and implemented multiple new ideas, otherwise thought of as futuristic. We, as a school, embraced the virtual transition with immense grit and unwavering determination. The virtual platform gave our parents an opportunity to understand and witness our pedagogical practices in action. Teachers adopted technology quicker than a hiccup as we understood that it was important for us to stay abreast, stay connected, and move forward. The students, being digital natives, were much ahead and adapted easily to the transition.

As a school, we want our students to be active learners, and technology has just done that. This has completely transformed the classroom experience. Making use of technology to allow self-learning and to give students the freedom to discover solutions to problems both independently and collaboratively using different digital tools is nothing but a positive change. For the offline and online classes in the month of November, we opened our doors to students for a period of three months. 50% of the students opted for offline classes, whereas the rest opted for online classes. Hence, the teaching happened in a hybrid model. This approach gave parents and children control over time, place, and pace of learning. We designed our learning environments to combine the best of both. Teachers structured their lessons differently to make the students more focused and interactive. We are indeed thankful to the parents who became very important stakeholders in their children's learning and ensured that the children completed the work that was assigned to them. We, with the guidance of our Head academics, have carefully designed our curricular and co-curricular activities in such a way that there is a positive learning engagement in the classroom, be it offline or online. We believe in tapping the talent of children at a young age. Various co-curricular activities that go beyond textbooks were planned and conducted. Some of these events are JAM sessions, poster making and slogan writing competitions. Competitions are also held for rhyme recitation, storytelling, show and tell, sports quiz competitions and many more. The Science, Maths, and English Olympiads were also conducted, and the students performed excellently at the local as well as national level. We are pleased to announce that Master Vedant Kumar of Grade 3 was ranked third in Telangana in the NSTSE-2022, and Baby Sennila of Grade 2 was ranked second in the zonal UCO examinations. Other events held during the previous academic year included PP Theme assemblies, Rangmanch-Cultural Fest, Fancy Dress Competition, card making, Best out of Waste, poster making, chart making, and dance competitions. "Education's purpose is to replace an empty mind with an open one." With the key objective of bringing out the hidden talent and critical thinking of the students, a science

symposium was conducted at the Venus campus with the theme-Say No to Plastic, which provided an opportunity for the learners to integrate many skills into one project. Our little seedlings participated in the event by presenting a model of a classroom which is free of plastic. Equal focus was given to inculcating values in children. Every month, a value is chosen, and children are encouraged to discuss and practise it at school. This creates a strong learning environment that enhances academic achievement and develops students' social and relationship skills that last throughout their lives. The positive learning environment is achieved through the positive values modeled by staff throughout the school. Values like honesty, integrity, kindness, inclusiveness, and responsibility are explained and modeled for the children. These values support the development of the whole child as a reflective learner within a calm, caring, happy, and purposeful atmosphere. Sports are very important for students as they help them to stay emotionally and physically healthy, which in turn helps them to easily focus on their studies. It also helps in developing leadership, patience, teamwork, and social skills. Sports competitions like the Huddle Race and karate were conducted in the school for the children who opted for offline classes. "A man's mind stretched by new ideas may never return to its original dimension." Children are born inquirers. They just need the right platform to shine. They need an outlet for their creativity and ideas as well as developing critical thinking skills. Keeping this in mind, our FEI management has come up with a school newsletter-Creek Gazette. This gives opportunities to students to showcase their articles, ideas, and poems. Going on a field trip enhances critical thinking skills and gives students a chance to think about a topic or theme from a different perspective. For students who had opted for online classes, virtual field trips were planned for them, and the children who were present for the offline classes were taken to the post office, traffic police station, and also on a nature walk. The pandemic has obviously had some grave impacts on the students. Not only there were many learning gaps which have become very obvious, children's health and physical fitness has become a huge concern. Children are slowly getting withdrawn into their shells while their social skills have taken a beating because they have not had social interaction for a long time. Hence, bringing children back to school and taking care of their physical and mental fitness is going to be the prime concern when schools reopen in the month of June. Huge efforts will be put forth in school this academic year to emphasize the emotional wellbeing of students. Children connecting more with each other, collaborating, spending time with each other to study is going to be encouraged as they have to get their social skills back on track.

LITERACY-NEED OF THE HOUR.

"No skill is more crucial to the future of a child, or to a democratic and prosperous society, than literacy." Early childhood (birth to 8 years) is a critical period of development and early literacy and early numeracy are two important skill areas that develop during this period. Literacy and numeracy development begins in the first three years of life and is closely linked with daily communications, actions, thoughts and drawings of young children. Parents and the home learning environment and interactions of young children with literacy materials as books, paper, and crayons are the building blocks for the development of language, reading, writing and numeracy. The purpose of early classes should be to equip children, through reading and also

through basic numeracy to become more independent learners. We believe foundational learning, or children's ability to read with meaning and do basic math calculations by class 3, forms the basis of all future learning. Foundational learning forms the basis of all future learning. Those who fail to attain basic literacy and numeracy skills by class 3 find it difficult to catch up with the rigour of the curriculum in later classes and fall behind, creating wide learning gaps. This also increases the chances of these students dropping out of the school system altogether. Equipping foundational literacy and numeracy, it allows the children to approach a solution in different ways and form different perspectives, strengthening not just their critical thinking but also setting a foundation for being more accepting and adapting to different approaches. At a younger age, they have to be exposed to as many different ideas and concepts as possible to allow a sense of wonder and curiosity to learn. Looking at today's corporate world, there is a growing demand for coders, problem solvers and aptitude-related jobs. "The goal of early childhood education should be to activate the child's own natural desire to learn"

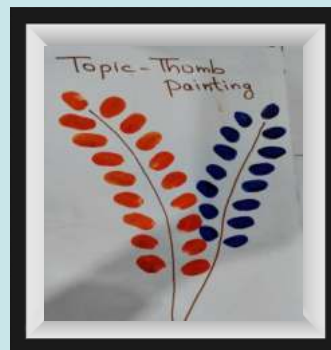

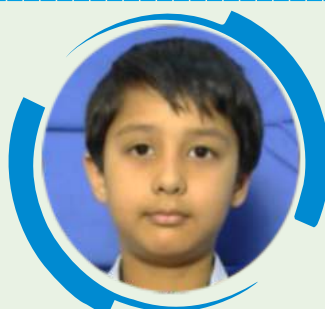

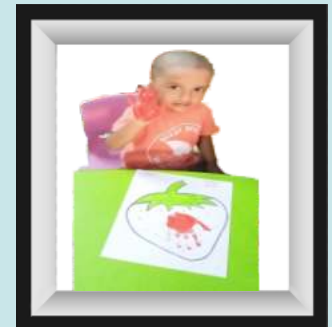
